Christmas Greetings from the Mountain State of West Virginia, USA.

Yes, Mika, you are correct, that would have been our station broadcasting on Saturday, Nov. 25 at 5:00 p.m. We are delighted that you were able to pick up our signal as we were broadcasting at 5000 watts. At night that is reduced to 1000 watts. Our 4 towers are located on Ward Rock Mountain at approximately 1667 feet elevation and are each 207 feet high. It is a shame that you weren't listening the previous day. You might have been shocked to hear one of your close "neighbors" reading letters from children, as he does every weekday until Christmas Eve. He will be giving his final special reading of letters from 4:30 to 5:00 p.m. this afternoon. He often has to reprimand Rudolph for his mischievous behavior during those broadcasts. Following his daily readings, "Mrs. Claus" reads a Christmas story to the listeners. We have been broadcasting this program "remotely from the North Pole" for over 6 decades.

We are a small coal mining community in Southwestern West Virginia, and are named after Chief Logan of the Mingo tribe of Native Americans, born about 1725. WVOW has broadcast continuously since May 5, 1952, and my family has been involved in its operation since 1954. We have some advertisers today who have been with us since that time.

Thank you for contacting us. It is about 7:30 p.m. your time. You had better get ready for the "big guy." NORAD says he is over Volograd, Russia, about now.

We wish you a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.
