You did indeed hear KPOF on Monday, January 16, 1995, and I do want to send materials that will verify your program reception. I am having my secretary provide that information for you. Also enclosed find some things that you can add to your collection as a DXer.

I have been above the Arctic Circle when I was on a coastal steamer going up the coastline of Norway up to the Russian border. My forebears on my mother's side are Norwegian. Bernard Christiansen was my grandfather's name, and he was born in Norway.

I am also glad to note your fine hobby. We are in Christian broadcasting, although we carry many public service programs, as well as fine classical music and informational content. We do hope that if you come once again to the United States that you will stop at our various stations.

I was interested in what you had to say about the 350th anniversary of Finnish immigrants coming to the U.S. I will look into that on my computer. I have a Compton encyclopedia that has ready information at my fingertips.

I appreciate your giving us the precise location of your reception point, and that the name Lemmenjoki translates as "Love River." It sounds like a very beautiful national park, and I would like to know more about those areas as well, especially since they


